Part of the Sudoeste Alentejano e Costa Vicentina Natural Park, Porto Covo was a small fishing village that prospered during the 20th century while holding onto all the quiet charm of its rows of immaculately whitewashed houses against which the sea provides a pleasing contrast.

Right by the village, Praia Grande Beach has all the characteristics of an urban beach with both good means of access and services and facilities. Surrounded by rocky cliffs, the sheltered sands are bathed in clean waters that on occasion throw up waves capable of attracting the surfing community.

Nearby the village of Carrapateira from where access is gained via a tarmac road, the wonderful Bordeira Beach extends over a broad stretch of sand that becomes one of the largest on the Algarve coast during low tide. A small river reaches the sea here and often forms a lagoon that is always a big hit with children.

Somewhat off the beaten track of sunbathers, Bordeira is in great demand among surfers and bodyboarders.

Closed off to the east by high cliffs and to the west by the Ponta de Sagres, which protects it from stronger winds, this bay-like beach has calm waters and is much appreciated for its diving conditions.

Late on, the café terraces and an impressive sunset best characterise the elegant, cosmopolitan and lively ambience of the nightlife in São Pedro de Moel.

Consolação Beach is divided into two contrasting areas. To the south, a rocky zone, which is highly rich in iodine and perfectly placed to catch the sun, offering excellent therapeutic conditions and attracting many people seeking respite from any number of bone diseases. To the north, the landscape is completely different. From the fortress onwards, there is a wide expanse of sand that continues onwards for various kilometres towards Peniche.

With the rough seas breaking on this stretch of coast, this Beach is particularly enjoyed by surfers and windsurfers.

Following the town of Costa da Caparica comes an expanse of sands that goes on to cover an approximate 30 kilometres through as far as Fonte da Telha and which mostly falls within the Arriba Fóssil (Fossil Cliff) Protected Area of Costa de Caparica. The sanded area may be divided into three main areas - the "Terras da Costa", "Acácias" and "Medos" - are themselves divided up into numerous beaches without any apparent dividing borders. They have gradually taken on various names, generally after the nearest café or restaurant or because they have a different entranceway off the main road.

All beaches have their own car parking facilities and are further linked by a very characteristic form of transport - the Transpraia - a small open train which sets off from the town of Costa and covers the length of this enormous beach as far as Fonte da Telha, with stops at numerous beaches on route. Given the sheer expanse of sand, these Beaches provide all the space needed for football and volleyball or simply setting off on a long walk along the shore. The sea is normally calm and inviting although occasional strong waves bring in the surfers and bodyboarders.

From the many, the Morena and Sereia Beaches are famous for their lively café terraces while the Castelo, Rei and Rainha Beaches offer a more family oriented environment. Meanwhile, Bela Vista Beach was the first to be purpose dedicated a naturist beach in Portugal. Fonte da Telha, the last stop on the Transpraia mini-train, is located right at the end of this long sandy stretch of coastline. The Beach covers some 2 kilometres, protected by a 70 metre high cliff that is now often used for hang-gliders to take off from.

Its large open sands are spacious enough to include beach volleyball and football facilities in addition to other support infrastructures including a car park that doubles up as an excellent viewpoint out over the surrounding coastline.

Throughout the summer season, this welcoming environment has a lifeguard and a bar/café with shelter from local winds provided by the 40 metre high promenade that is home to many restaurants, frequently specialising in shellfish dishes.

Estoril

With good access either by ramp leading up to the car park located at the top of the gully or by tunnel for those arriving by train, this Beach is one of the favourite attractions on the Estoril coast throughout summer.

At the extreme north of Praia Grande is one of the largest saltwater swimming pools in Europe at over 100 metres in length and owned by the Hotel das Arribas.

And, as an additional attraction, pay a visit to the dinosaur fossils to be found on the Beach's south cliff with one bed containing an easily identifiable sequence of eleven dinosaur footsteps.

Part of the Litoral de Esposende Protected Landscape, Apúlia Beach covers a large expanse of sand surrounded by dunes that serve to protect the Beach from stronger winds. The dunes are also home to former windmills that have now been converted into holiday homes.

A popular summer destination, the beach has every kind of service and facility and even comes with a specialist health recommendation given its richness in iodine. The abundance of seaweed is one of its greatest characteristics and resulted in one of the defining landmarks of Portugal's northern coastline - the "Sargaceiro da Apúlia", known thus due its purpose of collecting sargaço (the local name for seaweed), which was then used as fertiliser on surrounding fields.

To the south of the Cávado river mouth and part of the Litoral de Esposende Protected Landscape, Ofir Beach, surrounded by dunes and pine trees, covers one of the most beautiful stretches of the northern Portuguese coastline. One natural phenomena is the rocks emerging out of the sea at low tide and which form shapes known locally as the horses of Fão.

Throughout summer, there is always something going on. During the day, bathers tend to take to the waters in the central section of the beach while surfers head for the bigger waves breaking just south. The action continues well into the night at the various restaurants, bars and discos that surround the Beach.
