Along with its exceptional gastronomy and varied range of hotels, nowadays the Alentejo is one of the most important wine regions in the Country. Travel through the Wine Route and visit beaches, some of the most beautiful towns and cities of the Alentejo. And because wine calls for a good meal, **Seem to go** enjoy the appetizers, cheeses and cold meats of the Alentejo, the torresmos (pork rinds, served cold), **QUIET** grilled peppers, octopus salad and pezinhos de coentrada (pork's feet **reservoirs** with coriander).

As a second course, there are ensopados (a kind of stew), migas by green (mashed bread), excellent game, Veaetation caldeiradas (typical dishes made from several types of fish ), shark soup and grilled fish. 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# A WORLD OF AWESOME EXPERIENCES TO ENJOY AS A FAMILY...

Hand in hand with nature, and concerned with its conservation, the Alentejo hosts some of the most interesting THEME PARKS in the Country, such as Badoca Safari Park, in Santiago do Cacém, where visitors can experience an African safari and watch Giraffes, Gnus, Zebras and Oryx Gazelles, among more than 40 species in semi-freedom. The Monte Selvagem, in Montemor-o-Novo, has over 400 animals from 75 species, and its main purpose is to provide a home for wild animals and to raise public awareness about environmental issues and the conservation of biodiversity. With different features, the Fluviário de Mora – the first large-scale freshwater aquarium in Europe - recreates the life along a river, from source to estuary and shows exotic species from distant places such as the Amazon.

The fabulous RIVER OR OCEAN BEACHES scattered over the landscape of the Alentejo bring different experiences.

Almost deserted, wild, and ideal for families and water sports, there are beaches to suit all tastes in the Alentejo.

Even if you are only looking for a good beach for a swim or a long stretch of sand to put down your towel during the weekend or on holiday, the Alentejo offers you more.

# LIVING TRADITIONS

From the pilgrimage of Nossa Sra. d' Aires in Viana do Alentejo, on the fourth Sunday of September; the festivities of Nossa Sra. do Carmo, in Moura; to the famous Easter in Castelo de Vide, which still preserves the Jewish influence, and the participation of shepherds and their noisy rattles at the mass of blessings ; and the Feira da Luz in Montemor-o-Novo, with its concerts, handicrafts and bullfights, the POPULAR FESTIVITIES are varied and fill the calendar of the whole region. Places and time to enjoy the regional HANDICRAFTS. From Redondo to Viana, and S. Pedro do Corval, the largest pottery centre in the country, to Nisa, and its pottery decorated with stones, the production of utilitarian and decorative dishware is still alive in the Alentejo and is one of its trademarks. A must-see are the famous

woollen carpets of Arraiolos, the alinhavados (embroidery) of Nisa, or the blankets of Reguengos de Monsaraz and Mértola. Articles made of leather, cork and wood, the ceramic dolls of Estremoz, the pottery of Flor da Rosa, or the traditional clothes and rattles, are other popular local arts still alive in some towns and villages. Also impressive for visitors to the Alentejo is the traditional a capella singing, called O CANTE, with lyrics about rural work, melancholy, solitude, love and saudade (longing and nostalgia), and from which the *modas* were created. Men and women sang before, during and after their daily work and continued to sing at parties and pilgrimages, taverns and in the evenings at home. Today, many choirs spread throughout the region, continue to showcase this unique and authentic way of singing the Alentejo.

### WITNESSES TO HISTORY...

Remains have been found from distant Neolithic times to the Islamic period throughout the whole territory. This History can be found in the Northern and Central Alentejo, with its many megalithic remains such as in Reguengos de Monsaraz, or Castro da Cola, the Neolithic influence in Ourique, and, finally, the presence of the Roman civilization. Important are also Miróbriga, in Santiago do Cacém, Ammaia, in Marvão, or villae like Torre de Palma, in Monforte and S. Cucufate or Pisões which supplied the important Pax Julia (Beja), and the well preserved Roman Temple in Évora, the symbol of the ancient Roman centre. For the Islamic period, stop in Mértola, the most Arabic town in Portugal and enjoy its unique Mosque.

The Sanctuaries, bridges, roads, monographic museums and interpretation centres provide a whole chapter on the occupation of these civilizations - a must-see.

Also witnesses to the history and life of the Alentejo are the different MUSEUMS which are open to the public. The important painting, sculpture and decorative art collections of Friar Manuel do Cenáculo gathered in the Museum of Évora, the collection of tiles, religious art, and paintings of the Regional Museum Rainha Dona Leonor in Beja, the Museum of Arte Sacra (Religious Art) of the Sé de Évora (Cathedral), with one of the most beautiful collections of the genre in the Country, the Tapestry Museum in Portalegre, dedicated to the famous tapestries which reproduce the work of great artists like Le Corbusier or Vieira da Silva, and the Museum

of Contemporary Art in Elvas, which exhibits the work of national artists from the 80s until today, are some of the must-see museums in the Alentejo.

# ... AND TO LIFE(LIVES)

Another time, another experience – The Alentejo preserves and values the history and living experiences of the local people through the centuries. As some of the region's important mines have been progressively closed, several itineraries and installations have been created – for what is called THE MINING CIRCUIT – which shows the indelible mark left by this important activity on the memory of the people and the landscape. From Cercal do Alentejo to Lousal, from the important mine of Aljustrel, passing by Castro Verde, and then up to the unique mines of S. Domingos, there are museums installed in old facilities, guided tours, and excursions to discover this original industrial and geological heritage.

Another circuit not to be missed is the FRESCO ROUTE, which fills some of the most important churches in the Alentejo with beauty.

Humour your children and start your days in the Alentejo with a trip to the Sado Estuary. See the bottlenose community at close hand. The lovable dolphins that inhabit the estuary, will certainly delight your children.

Continuing our celebration of biodiversity, the next stop is Monte Selvagem, just a stone's throw away in Montemor-o-Novo. In Mora, visit the Fluviário, the first large freshwater aquarium in Europe. Close by, in the Reservoir of Maranhão, as well as the river beach, you can also enjoy water skiing lessons, swimming pools, camp sites, motor caravan parks, and apartments to rent.

From here, you can explore other water routes. The Ecotourism Centre of Ribeira Grande, in Fronteira, also has a small river beach, swimming pools, pedestrian routes and a well kept secret that is guaranteed to please the youngsters: an astronomy observatory equipped with the latest technology for sky photography.

RIVER BEACHES OF QUINTA DO ALAMAL AND TAPADA GRANDE In ravishing surroundings, the beach of Alamal, in Gavião, located on the Tagus River, is the perfect place for a family holiday, due to the quality of the water, good access, support facilities and surrounding green spaces. A world of leisure activities waiting to be discovered. From sports fishing to canoeing, from walks to routes for mountain bikes. To the south, in Mértola, near the S. Domingos Mines, Tapada Grande is an oasis in the midsummer. Located on a lagoon with small islands and surrounded by eucalyptus trees, it has good access and a lifeguard during the summer. The surrounding landscape is inviting for walks or canoe rides.

# INSECTOZOO

Dedicated to social insects like ants, termites, bees and wasps, this small museum located in Vila Ruiva, Cuba, has invested in ecological education, with guided tours that explain the role played by each insect for the regulation of the ecosystems which they inhabit. # ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION CENTRE OF VALE GONÇALINHO

Located in the cereal steppes of Castro Verde, this interactive complex is dedicated to the environmental resources and natural heritage of this unique region. Here you can watch the famous Great Bustard, Lesser Kestrels, European Rollers or Little Bustards, as well as the promotion of educational projects on sustainability, water, renewable energies and the fight against desertification.



TAPESTRY MUSEUM > Visit the Tapestry Museum of Portalegre and show your family one of the most unique expressions of the art of the Alentejo.

ÉVORA > The Roman Temple is a good example of historical conservation in the cultural city of Évora. Contemplate it during the day and at night.

hectares and an altitude of 1,025 meters, it is the highest location in the Alentejo. Among hills, valleys and creeks, the varied landscape is a wonderful world waiting to be explored on foot, or by mountain bike. The five routes indicated on the terrain, take you to an adventure over cliffs, ravines, among oak and European chestnut trees, walking along medieval stone paths towards plains dotted with cork oaks, holm oaks, and olive trees, discovering prehistoric paintings, or seeing birds, wild boars, genets, and several types of amphibians. Starting points are in Portagem, near the town of Marvão, and the village of Galegos. To enjoy the park to the fullest, the best option is to stay in one of its shelter houses or at the reception centre.

The Alentejo offers powerful takeoffs for those who dare to free fly. The Serra de Alcaria Ruiva, in Mértola is one of the best spots for paragliding. For paramotor fans, are the vast plains that make the best runways. The first competition in the skies of the Alentejo took place in 1991 in Castelo de Vide, presently the stage of an International Open that attracts the Portuguese and foreigners alike.

# PARACHUTING

Adrenaline is what you can expect at the Évora Aerodrome every weekend and public holiday. Jumping from 3,000 feet above the city takes courage, but is also a unique experience that will be remembered forever. For the fans of surfing, skysurfing is also happening here. For the less experienced, is the "tandem" variety, where you jump strapped to the instructor who controls the opening of the parachute.



# ORIENTEERING

At the end of the afternoon, when warm colours paint the skies, watch the sunset or try paragliding or hang gliding, taking off from the top of the coastline cliffs or inland mountains. For those who love to spend the early evening by the sea, there are plenty of beaches to discover from Zambujeira do Mar to Tróia. In early August, the Festival do Sudoeste in Zambujeira do Mar, and at the end of July, the Músicas do Mundo Festival (World Music) in Sines will delight music lovers who cannot bear a summer away without the sea. For surf lovers, the São Torpes beach is a great spot for surfing.

### RESERVOIRS

Places to live and experience, the many reservoirs of the Alentejo offer ideal conditions for water sports. Among the valleys surrounded by cork oak woodland [and pastures] from Montargil, Maranhão, Caia, Alvito, Divor, Pêgo do Altar, Santa Clara to the huge Alqueva are some ideal spots for activities like sailing, canoeing, rowing, swimming, water skiing, windsurfing, jet skiing, or a quiet boat ride to try your luck at fishing.



# NATURAL PARK OF VALE DO GUADIANA

From the mountain range of Serpa to the border with the Algarve are more than 69 thousand hectares of nature. A vast protected area, with seven pedestrian routes to discover places like the unique Pulo do Lobo or the mountain range of Alcaria, the highest point of the park, with a tremendous view of the plain from a height of 370 meters, the valleys of the Guadiana and its Mediterranean brushland, and a rich diversity of fauna and flora.

# A world of infinite possibilities

## BIRDWATCHING

Taking your binoculars and setting out to discover birds is an increasingly popular activity. With its wide variety of rare or common local and migrant birds, the Alentejo is exceptional for birdwatching all year round, from the valleys and river estuaries and the various Special Bird Protection Areas, to the large area of Campo Branco, in Castro Verde, where you can see the famous great bustards. The regions of Monforte, Évora, Reguengos de Monsaraz, Cuba or Nisa, are also some of the richest ornithological areas of the Alentejo and the country, and in the town of Mértola, with its unique community of lesser kestrels, or around Mourão, you can find golden plovers and southern grey shrikes.

Very rich in rare or common local and migrant birds, the Alentejo is an outstanding place for birdwatching.



TYPICAL SINGING (CANTE) FROM THE ALENTEJO Rural work, melancholy, solitude, love and saudade (longing) are some of the themes of the modas (songs) a capella singing. In the past men and women sang while they were working, and continued their singing at fairs and pilgrimages, taverns and the evenings at home. Nowadays, there are several choirs throughout the Lower Alentejo which disseminate this unique way of singing.

# **NATURAL PARK OF THE** SOUTH-WEST ALENTEJO AND **VICENTINE COAST**

Between São Torpes and the beach of Burgau, the Natural Park of the South-West Alentejo and Vicentine Coast extends for 110 km. The park has many different landscapes and is important biologically, with its cliffs, woods growing over sand and water lines, and its temporary lagoons.

# **MINING ROUTE OF ALJUSTREL**
